4. Annual Report	Kate reported it's been a busy year preparing for the Jigsaw Meadow project	
and updates	in the Autumn and Spring. We had the successful wreath making workshop	
a) Events &	in December, with pre-made wreath bases, a foliage walk and then a making	
Activities (KS &	session. Hopefully we will do this again this year. We did the New Year plant	
LW)	hunt, as suggested by Lee, and identified any wildflowers still in flower. The	
,	group saw several varieties, identified by some knowledgeable attendees.	
	Kate has the seedling stall outside her house. We had our Open Garden Day	
	with cakes and a plant swap in May, which was a nice event. New for this	
	year, we had a children's garden day, run by Lee, and Sonya's mini meadow.	
	Lee reported that we had the children's garden event for four hours in the	
	Summer. We planned for two but it was very popular. Lee's dad provided	
	tomatoes and sunflowers and there were some plants donated by Nottcutts.	
	The children made fat balls, planted plants in the area, and did a bug hunt.	
	People were really willing to be engaged and then eight people came to do	
	the butterfly hunt from the Alban Way to the Community Garden, where	
	they saw sixteen species. It was a shame that John O'Conner mowed the	
	meadow at Berner's Drive so we couldn't do a follow up event, but it was	
	good to see how many people came along.	

b) Berners Drive	Kate reported that despite the wet and slugs, the Community Garden is	
& CCCC (KS)	doing well. The autumn fruiting raspberries are doing well there, and people	
	seem to be picking them. We have just planted some winter salads for	
	people. We've sown a plants for pollinators down there in the triangle area.	
	At the Community Centre, we have the beds for the Scouts and Leeanna's	
	Wish's youth group, so we are getting more people involved.	
c) Mini-meadow	Sonya reported that last year, John O'Conner mowed it last year before the	
and Abbots	seeds had been collected. It started to flower in Spring and there was lots	
Avenue planters	going on in February, where there was a lot of rain and it was late to cut. It	
(SJ)	was grassy but the Scouts came and did some planting before John O'Conner	
	cut it again. We have put a request into John O'Conner to say what we want	
	and they want us to meet their Biodiversity rep, who will advise us what we	
	should be doing(!). We note that we have had expert advice from local	
	groups and feel that perhaps the mowing rather than the planting is the	
	problem. John O'Conner has put in guidance so that people on the ground	
	must phone their manager rather than overruling the mow maps.	
	The Scouts have nearly finished their nature badge, although the mowing	
	meant they couldn't finish.	
	We usually do evening sessions at the plants, although there has been	
	scaffolding up. It is now taken over by lemon balm and bindweed, so we	
	need to get in and do a session now the scaffolding has gone.	
d) Jigsaw	We got seeds from John O'Conner as compensation for the last time they	
Meadow Project	mowed down the meadow. Some of Sandy Walkington's locality budget also	
(KS & SJ)	went towards the project.	
	Sandridge were doing their Jigsaw Meadow last year, and Sonya thought it	
	would work well in Sopwell. The launch of the project was successful, where

	we handed out around 50 packs of seeds and participants had the option to
	listen to advice on planting from speakers at the event.
	The Jigsaw Meadow was a great opportunity to connect individuals and
	organisations around the area. At the upcoming Autumn Festival, we are
	going to have a small exhibition of pictures on foamex boards of people's
	pictures of their meadows (and this may end up at the Abbey Line station as
	a pop-up exhibition).
	Michalla nated that it took a long time for her coads to grow but now they
	Michelle noted that it took a long time for her seeds to grow, but now they
	have and they look great.
	Gail suggested perhaps making some of the pictures bigger and they could be
	used to decorate e.g. the Centre.
5. Financial	The total income is c.£1.7k and the expenditure was c.£1.5k, mainly on
Report (NCM &	training (£348) and events (£450). Event spend was higher than last year, but
RB)	the rest of the expenditure was similar to last year. Our bank balance is
	currently just under £3k, although there are a few cheques still to go out.
	Gail asked if there were plans for the money. We keep £1k reserve, after
	owings we have £1.6k to spend, although some of this is allocated to hall hire
	from previous grants. Kate would like to spend some on compost for the
	raised beds outside the Community Centre. Kate would like to get a
	noticeboard behind the bench at the Community Garden.
	Sian noted that the Church (St Stephen's) is looking at boards to put around
	the churchyard to explain the different plants in the area. We would like to
	hand signs but we need to work with the Council to work out how we can do
	this as we have restrictions under our Licence to Occupy. Gail thinks signs
	would be useful to get more people involved. It would also be helpful to

	indicate to John O'Conner it's a no-mow area and help residents know what	
	the area is. Sonya's positive take away is that another member of the public	
	reported it, and there was community interest in the garden.
